



With surprise guest speakers and performances, International Greenwich Olympiad promotes collaboration, learning, and a healthy competitive spirit.







Their work will be assessed by the judges however they will not receive any feedback on this day. This is a one-day event, and at the end of the Exhibition, students will be required to pack away their display work.

On the Day

- Please bring your IGO ID Badge
- There will be staff members in the reception waiting to register you.
- The Exhibition will take place on the first and second floors of North London Grammar School. A staff member will take you to your allocated space.
- Please note that the Exhibition will take place during school hours. Therefore, **the other areas of the building are restricted.** Please be aware of the signs, and if you have any questions, IGO staff members are here to help!





GETTING AROUND LONDON



MIND THE GAP

London has one of the most iconic transportation links in the world, including the revolutionary London Underground and the various red buses, all thanks to Transport for London (TfL).

You can download the following apps that can ease your travels (Both on IOS and Google Play):



Citymapper
(Recommended!)

Public transport app for the underground and buses.



Google Maps

Google Maps is a popular and widely used navigation app in the UK.

Paying in the UK

Be aware of any potential fees or charges that your bank may apply for international transactions, and consider notifying your bank of your travel plans to avoid any disruptions.

There are various options to pay in the United Kingdom, such as:

- **Credit and Debit Cards** – Major credit and debit cards, such as Visa, Mastercard, American Express, and Discover, are widely accepted in most establishments throughout the UK. You can use your card for purchases at restaurants, shops, hotels, and other businesses. However, it is always a good idea to inform your bank or credit card company about your travel plans to avoid any potential issues with card usage abroad, including unexpected blocks or fraud alerts.
- **Contactless Payments** – Contactless payment methods, such as contactless credit/debit cards and mobile payment services like Apple Pay and Google Pay, are widely accepted in the UK. These options allow you to make payments by simply tapping your card or smartphone on a contactless-enabled terminal. The maximum transaction limit for contactless payments may vary, but it is typically around £45. Some places also accept mobile payment apps like WeChat Pay and Alipay, particularly in areas popular with Chinese tourists.
- **Currency Exchange** – If you prefer to use cash, you can exchange your currency for British Pounds at banks, currency exchange offices, or ATMs (automated teller machines). ATMs are widely available throughout the UK, and you can withdraw cash in British Pounds using your foreign debit or credit card. However, keep in mind that your bank may charge foreign transaction fees or currency conversion fees for ATM withdrawals and card transactions.

oyster® card

An Oyster card is a quick and easy way to pay for travel on public transport in London. It can be used on all TfL services.*

The pay-as-you-go credit on your Oyster card never expires, so you can keep your card until your next visit or lend it to family and friends



- Oyster Ticket Stops in many newsagents in London
- At all Tube, London Overground and most Elizabeth line stations
- Some DLR stations
- At Visitor Centres

You can get a visitor Oyster card, which is beneficial, which includes pay-as-you-go credit. You can get it:

- Online
- In visitor centres in Heathrow, King's Cross & St Pancras International, Liverpool Street Tube station, Liverpool Street Tube station and Victoria rail station.

Alternatively, you can use your debit/credit card, which essentially functions as an Oyster card! Just remember to touch in and touch out.

*Please note that Oyster cards aren't accepted at Elizabeth line stations between Reading and Iver.

Don't forget!

You will be provided with London Day Travel Card for your London Day Travel Trips! The travel card can be used till 11:59pm on the same day.



Best places to get souvenirs

Whilst the city itself has an endless number of retail stores, it is essential to get your souvenirs from reputable shops. We have sound recommendations regarding where you can prove that you've been to London and the UK, including:

- **Uniqlo:** Recent collaboration with TfL, producing a unique take on the culture of London's transportation system, but only available in Covent Garden.
- **Primark:** One of the most popular clothing brands, reinforced with the Greggs x Primark fashion collection.
- **Hamleys:** Located on Reagent Street, it is the world's oldest and largest toy store, selling various figures and souvenirs.
- **M&M London:** The Piccadilly Circus store features a wide array of M&M's merchandise, including various flavours of M&M's candies, apparel, accessories and novelty items. The store often showcases limited-edition or exclusive M&M products unavailable elsewhere.
- **Harry Potter store at Platform 9 3/4:** The iconic store in King's Cross St. Pancras.
- **Marks and Spencer:** A renowned British multinational retailer with a rich history that dates back to 1884. It operates a wide range of high-quality clothing, home products, and luxury food items.



Food Services

London has a massive number of eateries that can fill in your cravings. From well known fast food chains to even UK favourites, there is something for everyone. Many places to eat that are exclusive in London and in the UK such as:

- **Flat Iron** – Specializing in steak, Flat Iron offers high-quality, affordable cuts of meat with a simple yet delicious menu.
- **Borough Market** – This vibrant food market in Southwark is a food lover's paradise, offering a wide range of fresh produce, street food, and international delicacies.
- **Mildred's** – Having a long history back in 1988, this chain of restaurants serves good value, fresh and colourful, international vegetarian food.
- **Leadenhall Market** – A buzzy, beautiful and airy market in the heart of the City of London boasts a unique selection of boutiques, shops, restaurants and bars. It is a hidden gem – outdoors and covered – with rich heritage and stunning architecture dating back to the 14th century.

Alternatively, if you plan to buy lunch, there are many places that suit your needs. London offers a wide variety of options, including:

- **Supermarkets** – Major supermarket chains like Tesco, Sainsbury's, and Waitrose have branches throughout London. They usually have deli sections offering ready-made sandwiches, salads, wraps, and other lunch options.
- **Pret A Manger** – This well-known chain has numerous locations across London. They offer a range of freshly prepared sandwiches, salads, soups, and snacks.
- **Greggs** – A popular bakery chain in the UK, Greggs is known for its freshly baked pastries, sandwiches, and savory snacks. They have multiple branches in London.


DON'T FORGET

International Greenwich Olympiad is organised and sponsored by North London Grammar School.


